Relax and weave a unique textile reflecting your own approach to colour, texture and design. Based on the Japanese Saori handweaving philosophy of free weaving, participants will be inspired to weave to their own rhythm. Saori inspired handwoven cloth is very unique and reflects the maker in an immediate and intimate way. Simple and innovative, creative techniques will be taught on looms that are all pre-warped so participants can start weaving straight away.

Complete weave newbies, experienced weavers, artists, crafters, rigid heddle weavers and fibre lovers will all find new and fresh ways of weaving with a mix of new and traditional techniques creating new forms.

### What you need to bring:

1. Notebook or Journal
2. Glue stick, pens, pencils
3. Tape Measure
4. Scissors for thread, scissors for paper

NB All weft yarns will be supplied by CuriousWeaver Studio. Each person will be charged individually on weight of completed fabric at 15c per gram. Students should allow up to approximately \$40 per person for materials, but it is based on what is woven eg a final cloth weighing 400 g will be \$60. The final cost will depend on the type of weaving fibre used and amount of cloth woven by each participant.
